Hedgehog Rescues

Now that autumn is with us, hedgehogs are getting ready to hibernate. They are one of only three mammals in the UK that hibernate, along with dormice and bats. Last Friday, some of the children spotted an injured hedgehog on the playground. It was quite large so we thought it was an adult. There is a local vet that takes in hedgehogs so Mr Wells and Miss Berry carefully transported it there. Then this week we again saw a hedgehog on the playground. This time it was a hoglet (baby hedgehog). It was very bright and alert and when Miss Bradnock put some dog food out, it gobbled it up. However, we suspected that the injured hedgehog might have been it's mum. Usually there is something wrong if a hedgehog is out in the daytime, and this one definitely wasn't big enough to hibernate. So once again we had to perform a hedgehog rescue. The hedgehog was taken to the vets, where they will look after it until the spring and then release it. Before it went, it posed for some photos. Thank you to everyone who helped look after these beautiful little creatures.
