## Industrial Action

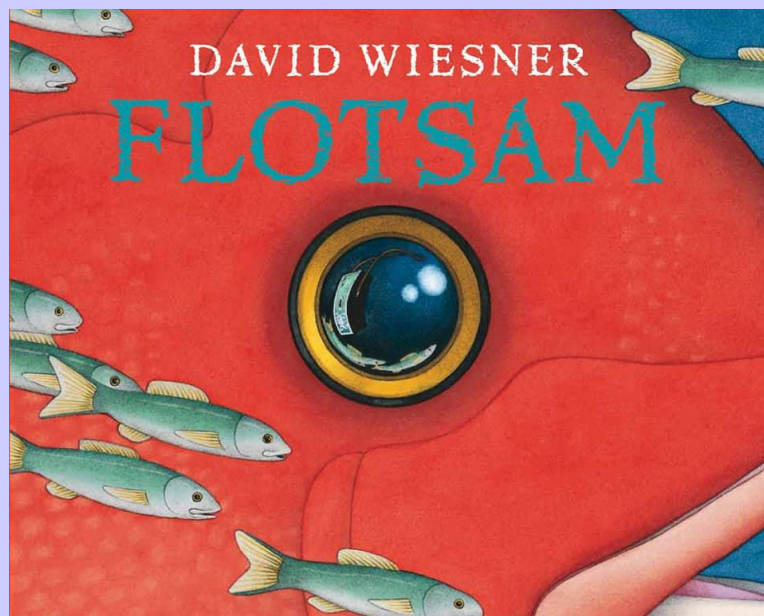
